

Bear Head Car

You will need:

- 2 x Bear Heads
- 4 x 350 or 360 Black
- 2 x contrasting 350 or 360
- 1 x 646 or 660
- 1 x 260



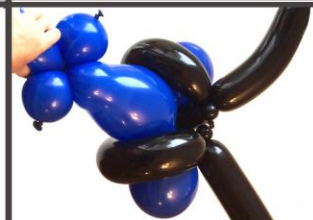
Inflate two bear heads. Apply a little pressure when inflating to ensure the lobes fill first. The second lobe will need more encouragement. If you inflate this way you will find the bear heads pretty reliable.



Make a twist 4" from the lip of the balloons and twist them together.



Inflate two black 350 or 360 balloons. Make a bubble at the lip end and wrap the balloon around one of the lobes. Twist the loop into the first bubble.



Do the same with another black balloon over the opposite lobe.



Make a bubble about 12" in each of the black balloons and extend each to the opposite side, wrapping them into the opposite balloon.



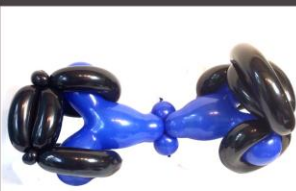
Go over a couple more times to form the back of the car. Here I have made the last bubble bigger so it sits higher.



Add another wheel to the front of the car.



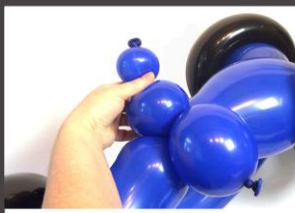
Add another wheel to the opposite lobe and as before extend bubbles across from one side to the other but don't make so many as this will be the front of the car. Don't worry if the car sits funny.



Remove any surplus black balloon. Wrap the ends in. Also wrap the lips in to pinch the first bubbles. This will make the model much tidier.



Inflate a 350 or 360 balloon. This can be the same colour as the bear heads or a contrasting colour. Wrap it into the back of the car as shown. All further balloons will be the same colour.



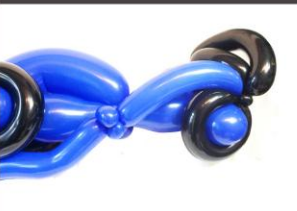
Make a bubble in one of the connecting bear head balloons at the middle of the car.



Extend a bubble from the back of the car to this bubble and wrap it in. You can also wrap the lip of the bear head in forming a pinched bubble for neatness.



Inflate the 660 or 646 so that it is slightly longer than the length of the car from the middle to the front. Wrap the lip into the middle of the car.



Ease the end of the 660 or 646 balloon down into the dip of the front bear head.



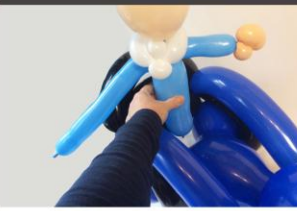
Now bring the remaining length of the 360 balloon over the front wheel and find the length that sits it nicely against the wheel. Wrap it into the pinch twist on the front of the wheel.



Do the same on the other side of the car.



Front view
You could add a 260 or 160 balloon across the front to represent the bumper.



Here I have made a man with a 350 body. By pushing the 350 balloon down into the hollow space between the bear head shape it fits in beautifully.



“Where’s my steering wheel?”



Inflate a 260 balloon to about 18” in length. Wrap one end into the bubble running from the junction of the bear heads. Bring the balloon through the hands and wrap the other end in on the opposite side of the bear heads.



Here I have added two round balloons to the front of the car for the head lights.
